It gives me immense satisfaction to present the Annual Report of Kalinga Yuva Sena Trust for the financial year 2023-24. This report reflects our commitment to expansion of animal welfare work and the launch of the free Swarg Rath service.

Our work is guided by a simple belief: every living being deserves protection, food, treatment and dignity. Throughout the year, our volunteers and supporters continued to respond to injured and abandoned animals, arrange veterinary care, provide food and fodder, and build public awareness about compassion and responsible community action.

The audited accounts record total income of Rs. 679,115 and total expenditure of Rs. 143,839. These resources were used primarily for animal food, veterinary medicines, rescue logistics, shelter-related expenses and essential administration.

I offer my heartfelt gratitude to our trustees, staff, caretakers, veterinarians, volunteers, donors and well-wishers. Their faith and participation have enabled the Trust to continue serving both voiceless animals and vulnerable people with sincerity.

TOTAL INCOME

FY 2023-24

The financial year 2023-24 required disciplined coordination of rescue response, medicines, food, shelter needs, transportation and community participation. Our focus remained on programme continuity, financial discipline and the strengthening of humanitarian support.

Public and supporter contributions of Rs. 674,115, together with annual membership fees of Rs. 5,000, formed the principal income of the Trust. Total expenditure was Rs. 143,839. The largest programme costs related to animal food, veterinary medicines and essential operations.

We remain committed to maintaining proper records, audited accounts and responsible utilization of every contribution. The support of volunteers, veterinary professionals, staff members and community well-wishers continues to be the foundation of our work.

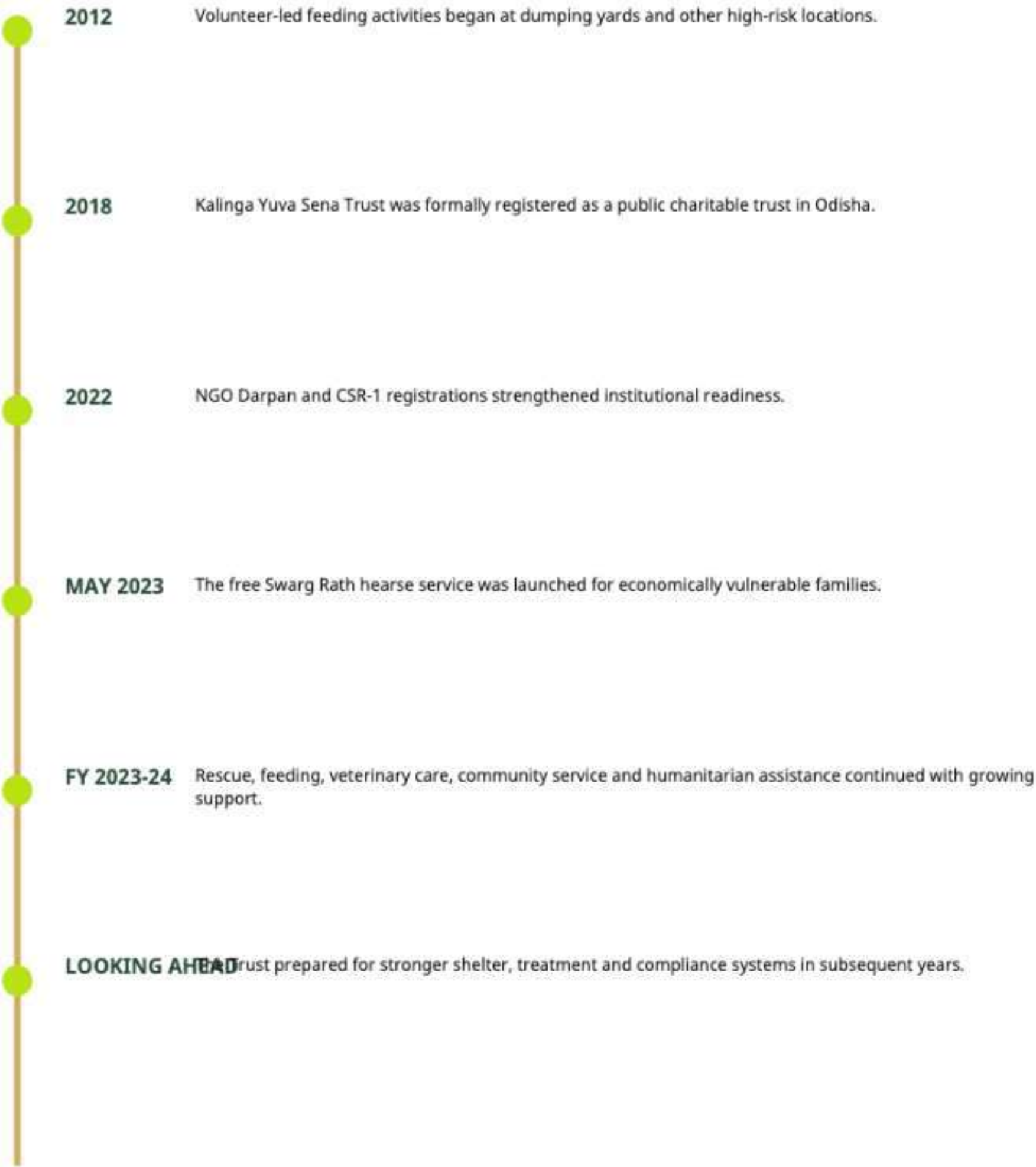

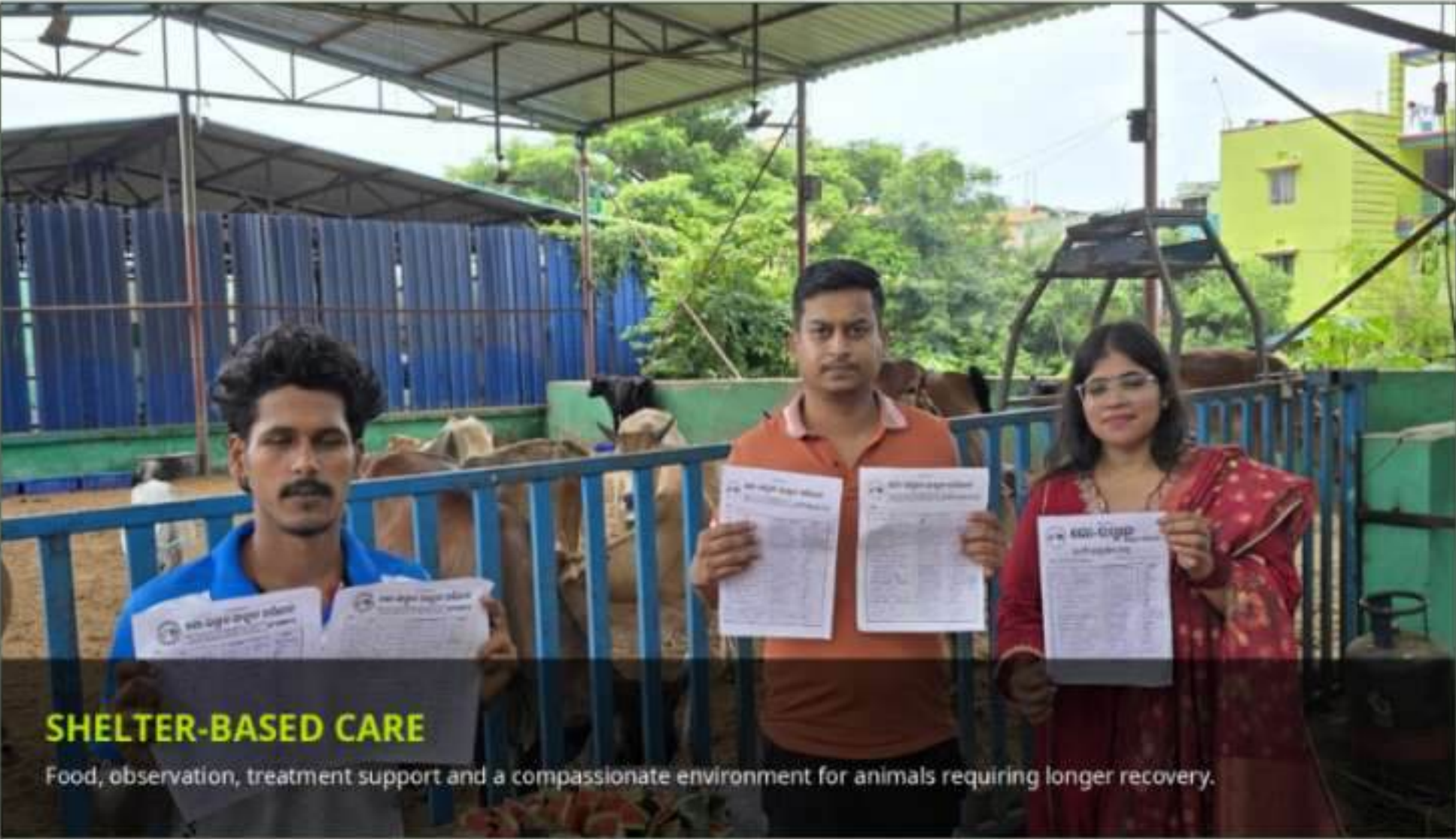

SHELTER-BASED CARE

Food, observation, treatment support and a compassionate environment for animals requiring longer recovery.

Core Shelter Functions

- Admission and stabilization of rescued cattle requiring continued care.
- Regular food, water, cleaning and observation by caretakers and volunteers.
- Veterinary consultation, medicines, wound dressing and fracture support.
- Recovery monitoring and rehabilitation before release, where appropriate.
- Long-term sanctuary for animals that cannot safely return to the streets.
- A community space for awareness, volunteering and compassionate celebrations.

The current shelter infrastructure shown in photographs may reflect improvements made after the audited year. It is included to demonstrate the continuing development of Kalinga Gauseva Dham.

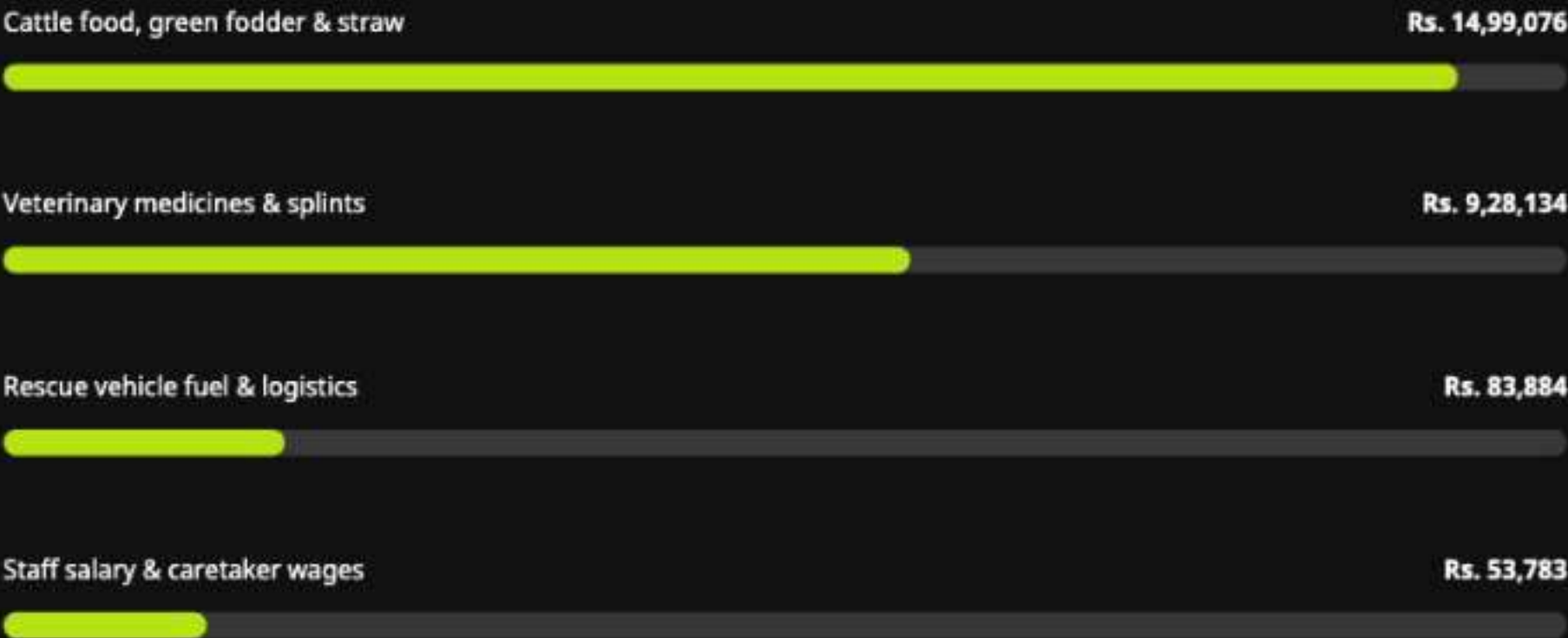

Stories of Recovery I

Rescue, treatment and patient rehabilitation



01 MOB VIOLENCE SURVIVOR

A gentle bull was attacked while eating food in a compound and suffered a life-threatening shoulder wound. After difficult capture, veterinary support and months of intensive treatment, the bull recovered. Its scar remains a symbol of resilience.



02 ROAD ACCIDENT RECOVERY

A vehicle crushed a cow's hind leg, causing a serious fracture. The team provided initial dressing, shelter admission and plaster support under veterinary guidance. After a month of treatment, the fracture healed and the cow regained mobility.



03 HEALING FROM AN OIL BURN

Hot oil was thrown on an innocent cow, causing severe burns. The Trust rescued her, began regular dressing and followed a veterinary medication plan. She was moved to safety and gradually began healing and trusting people again.

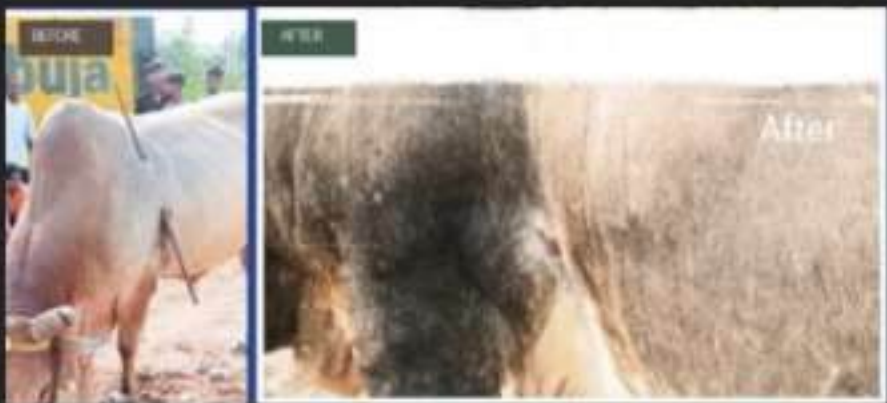
Stories of Recovery II

Specialized care, difficult outcomes and lessons for the community



04 TUMOUR REMOVAL

A large and painful tumour made daily life unbearable for a cow. The Trust coordinated skilled veterinary surgery and post-operative treatment, resulting in a strong recovery and a pain-free life.



05 SURVIVING AN ATTACK

A sharp metal object was deliberately driven into a bull after it entered a crop field. Rescue, careful wound dressing and prescribed medicines helped the deep injury heal completely.



06 SPINAL RECOVERY

A truck accident left a cow unable to stand. A supportive hanging machine was used to safely reduce pressure on the spine while treatment and rehabilitation continued.



07 A CALF'S BRAVE FIGHT

A pickup vehicle ran over all four legs of a calf. A Thomas splint and round-the-clock care supported a 15-day fight for survival. The calf ultimately passed away, leaving a powerful warning against reckless driving.

Feeding & Water Support

Safe food and clean water for animals at streets, shelter and high-risk locations



Food with Purpose

The Trust provides food and fodder to cattle and other stray animals, with special attention to dumping yards and waste sites where animals are at risk of consuming plastic, polythene and toxic material.

Water Support in Summer

Community water pots and awareness messages encourage citizens to provide clean drinking water during Odisha's intense summer months.

Why Dumping-Yard Feeding Matters

- Reduces direct consumption of plastics and non-biodegradable waste.
- Provides predictable nutrition for animals living near garbage sites.
- Helps prevent digestive impaction, infection and avoidable suffering.
- Creates public awareness about responsible disposal and animal welfare.

Road Safety & Seasonal Care

Simple interventions that prevent suffering before it occurs



Radium Band Drive

Reflective bands placed around street dogs, cattle and other stray animals catch vehicle headlights and make the animals visible from a safer distance. This low-cost intervention helps prevent night-time collisions and protects both animals and commuters.

Safety Message

Slow down near animals, avoid honking aggressively, and report injured animals promptly. Responsible driving saves lives.

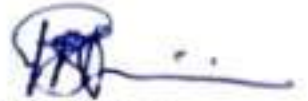
