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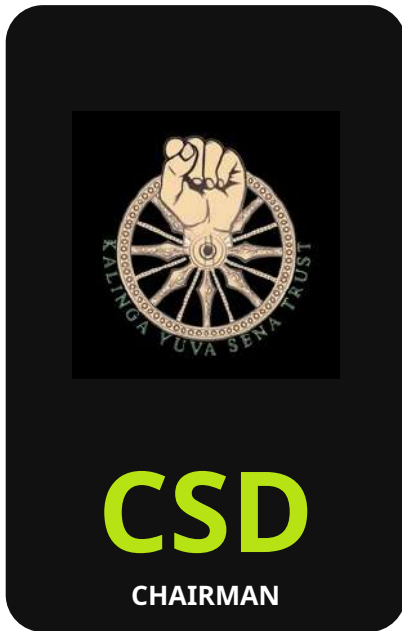

It gives me immense satisfaction to present the Annual Report of Kalinga Yuva Sena Trust for the financial year 2024-25. This report reflects another year of compassion, responsibility and dedicated service towards injured, abandoned and voiceless animals, as well as families facing difficult circumstances.

Our journey is founded on a simple belief: every living being deserves dignity, protection and timely care. During the year, our team completed approximately 470 animal rescue and treatment interventions, maintained feeding activities throughout all 365 days, and supported more than 125 families through the free Swarg Rath service. These are not merely statistics; they represent suffering reduced, lives protected and families treated with dignity.

None of this work would have been possible without the commitment of our trustees, staff, caretakers, veterinary professionals, volunteers, donors and well-wishers. Every contribution - financial, material or voluntary - has strengthened our ability to respond to those in need.

As we move forward, we remain committed to expanding Kalinga Gauseva Dham, strengthening emergency rescue services and building a more compassionate community. I offer my heartfelt gratitude to everyone who has stood beside the Trust.

Message from the Secretary

Mr. Anil Kumar Rout

The financial year 2024-25 was a year of continuous service, operational responsibility and meaningful progress. Our focus remained firmly on providing free rescue, treatment, food, shelter and rehabilitation to injured and abandoned cattle while strengthening humanitarian assistance for vulnerable families.

Managing animal welfare operations requires timely rescue coordination, committed staff, veterinary support, medicines, nutritious fodder, transport and continuous observation. Our records reflect 120 in-house cases and 350 animals treated at the spot. The feeding programme continued without interruption for all 365 days, while the Swarg Rath service assisted more than 125 families.

Public and supporter contributions formed the foundation of our work. The Trust recorded total income of Rs. 28,61,607 and expenditure of Rs. 26,41,032. Major resources were directed towards cattle food, fodder, veterinary medicines, splints and emergency rescue logistics.

We remain committed to accountability, stronger documentation and the careful use of every contribution. On behalf of the Trust, I sincerely thank the governing body, staff, volunteers, doctors, donors and community supporters for carrying this mission forward.

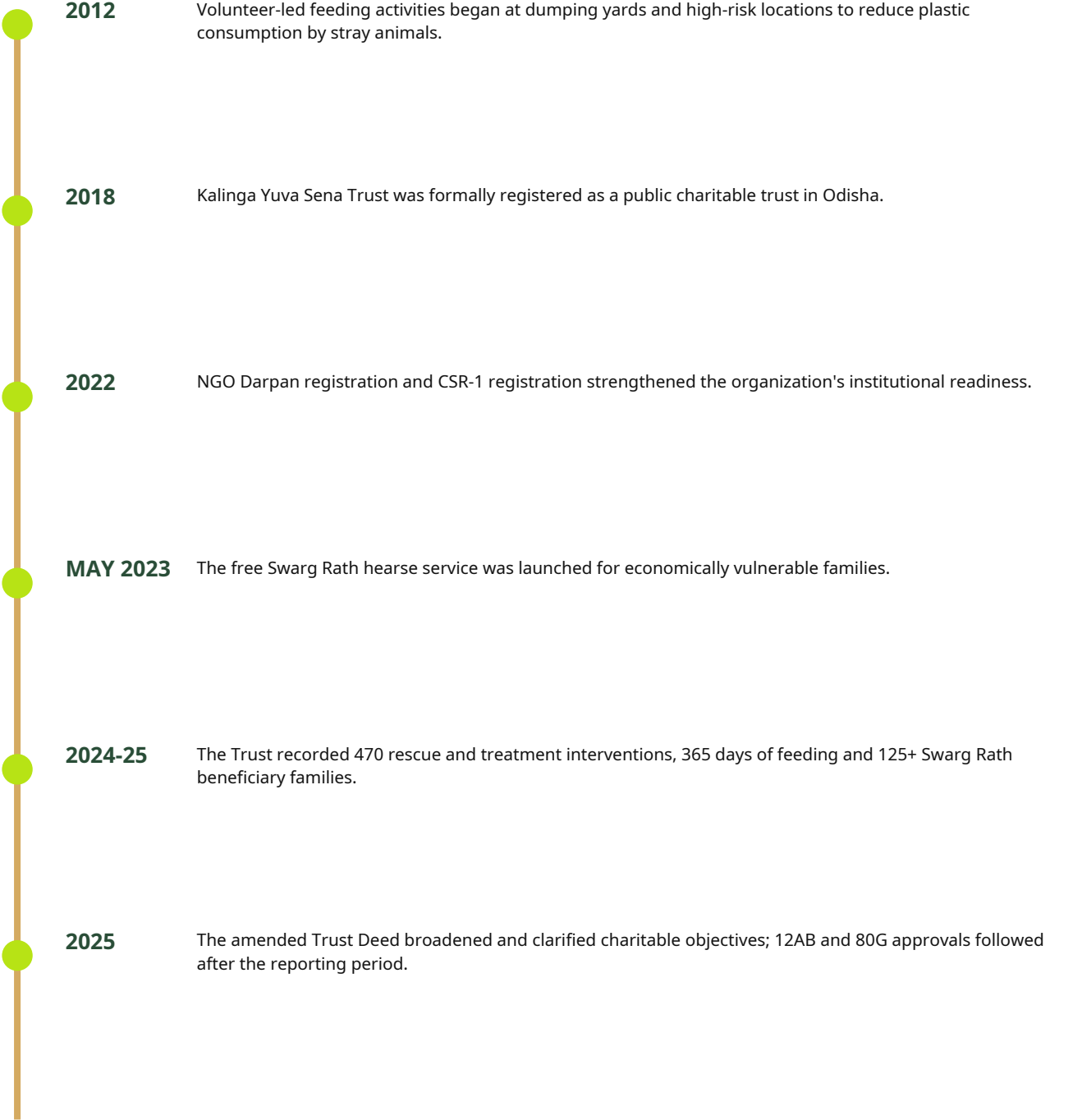

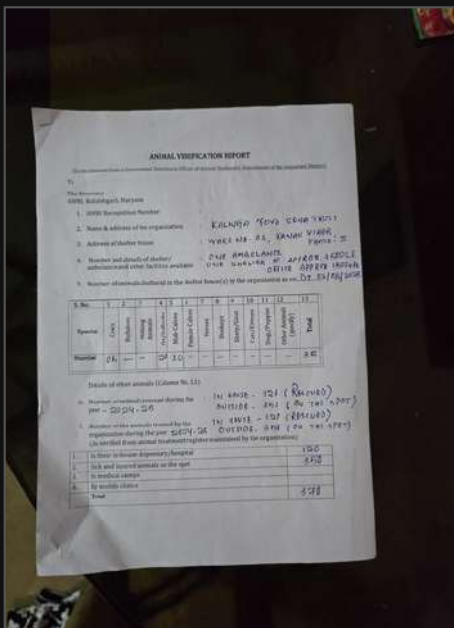

The veterinary verification records 120 in-house cases and 350 on-the-spot cases for 2024-25. It also records one ambulance and a shelter/office facility. The handwritten total was clarified by the Trust as 470 based on the itemized figures.

- Each rescue involves transport, veterinary consultation, medicines, dressing and follow-up.
- Feeding on all 365 days requires uninterrupted volunteer and logistics support.
- Swarg Rath assistance removes a major financial burden during bereavement.

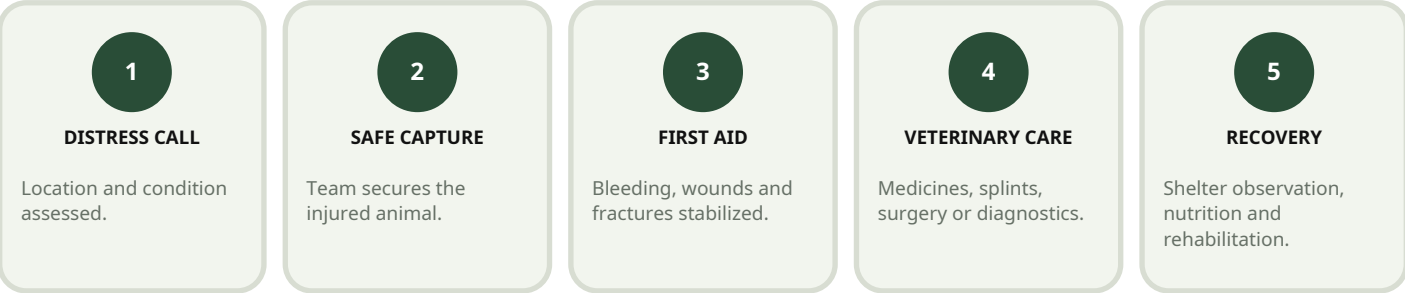

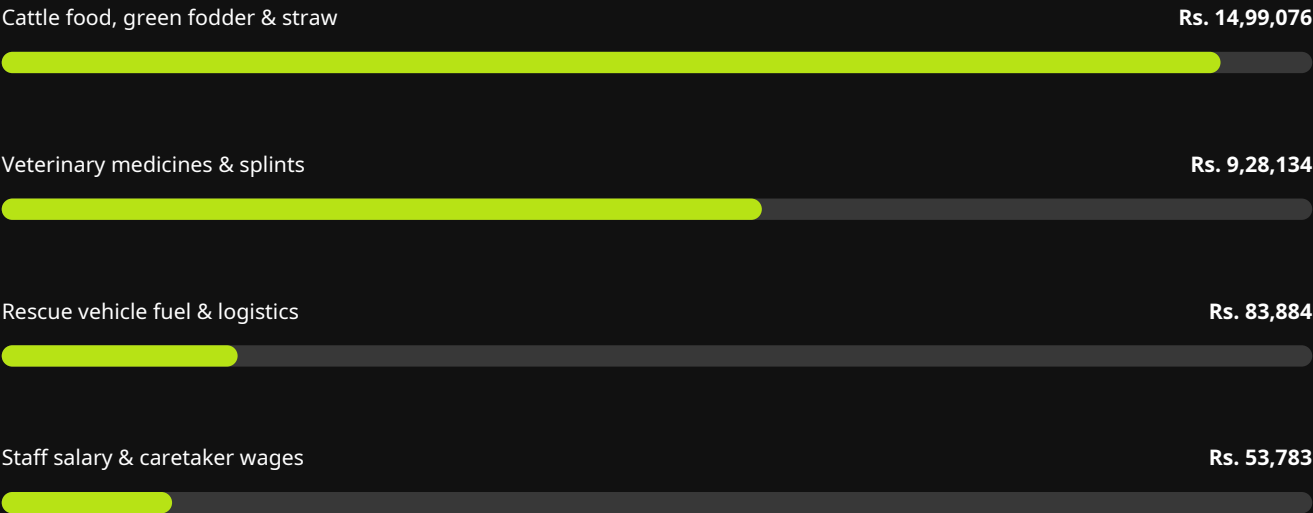

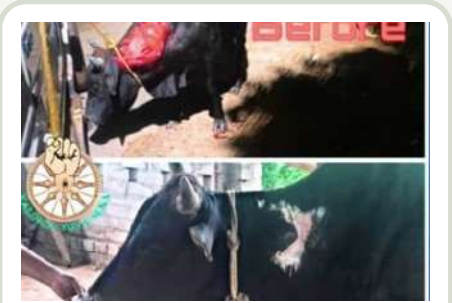


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Emergency care is not a single act. It is a chain of timely decisions, skilled support and patient follow-up.

Stories of Recovery I

Rescue, treatment and patient rehabilitation



01 MOB VIOLENCE SURVIVOR

A gentle bull was attacked while eating food in a compound and suffered a life-threatening shoulder wound. After difficult capture, veterinary support and months of intensive treatment, the bull recovered. Its scar remains a symbol of resilience.



02 ROAD ACCIDENT RECOVERY

A vehicle crushed a cow's hind leg, causing a serious fracture. The team provided initial dressing, shelter admission and plaster support under veterinary guidance. After a month of treatment, the fracture healed and the cow regained mobility.



03 HEALING FROM AN OIL BURN

Hot oil was thrown on an innocent cow, causing severe burns. The Trust rescued her, began regular dressing and followed a veterinary medication plan. She was moved to safety and gradually began healing and trusting people again.

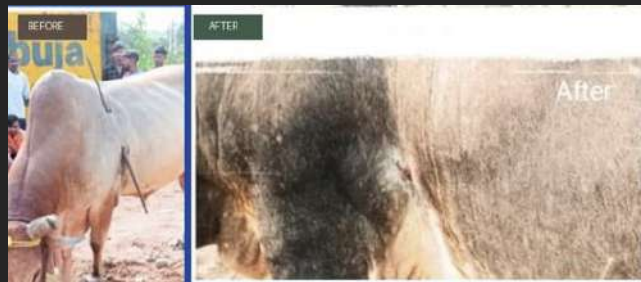
Stories of Recovery II

Specialized care, difficult outcomes and lessons for the community



04 TUMOUR REMOVAL

A large and painful tumour made daily life unbearable for a cow. The Trust coordinated skilled veterinary surgery and post-operative treatment, resulting in a strong recovery and a pain-free life.



05 SURVIVING AN ATTACK

A sharp metal object was deliberately driven into a bull after it entered a crop field. Rescue, careful wound dressing and prescribed medicines helped the deep injury heal completely.



06 SPINAL RECOVERY

A truck accident left a cow unable to stand. A supportive hanging machine was used to safely reduce pressure on the spine while treatment and rehabilitation continued.

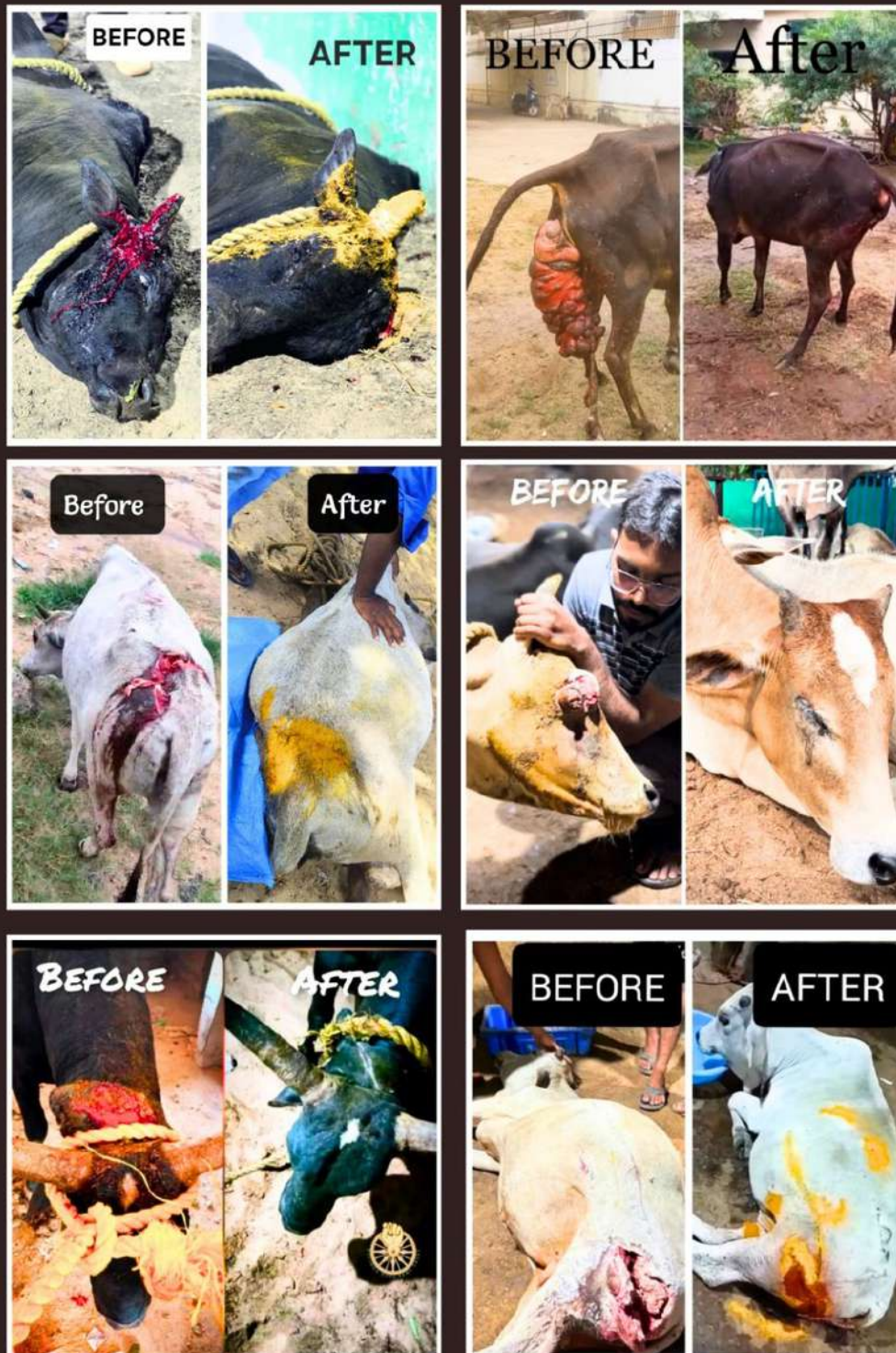


07 A CALF'S BRAVE FIGHT

A pickup vehicle ran over all four legs of a calf. A Thomas splint and round-the-clock care supported a 15-day fight for survival. The calf ultimately passed away, leaving a powerful warning against reckless driving.

DAYS OF REGULAR FEEDING

The Trust remained on the ground throughout the year, providing food to cattle, dogs, cats, birds, monkeys and other stray animals. Feeding at dumping yards is especially important because it reduces the risk of animals consuming plastic, polythene and toxic waste.

Summer Water Support

Odisha's intense summer heat creates a severe risk of dehydration. The Trust places and promotes water pots across the community, while encouraging citizens to refill them and keep them clean.

Why Dumping-Yard Feeding Matters

- Prevents direct consumption of plastics and non-biodegradable waste.
- Reduces digestive impaction, infection and avoidable death.
- Provides predictable nutrition to animals living near waste sites.
- Creates public awareness about responsible disposal and animal welfare.

Road Safety & Seasonal Care

Simple interventions that prevent suffering before it occurs

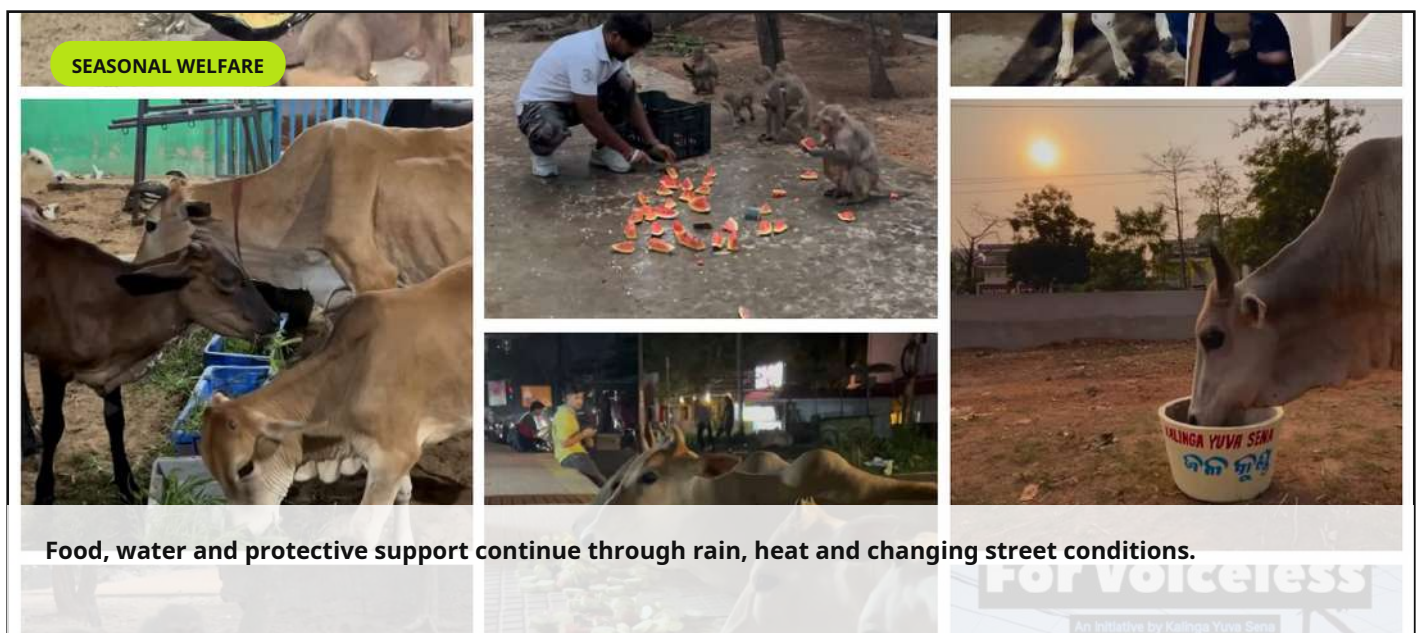


Radium Band Drive

Reflective bands placed around street dogs, cattle and other stray animals catch vehicle headlights and make the animals visible from a safer distance. This low-cost intervention helps prevent night-time collisions and protects both animals and commuters.

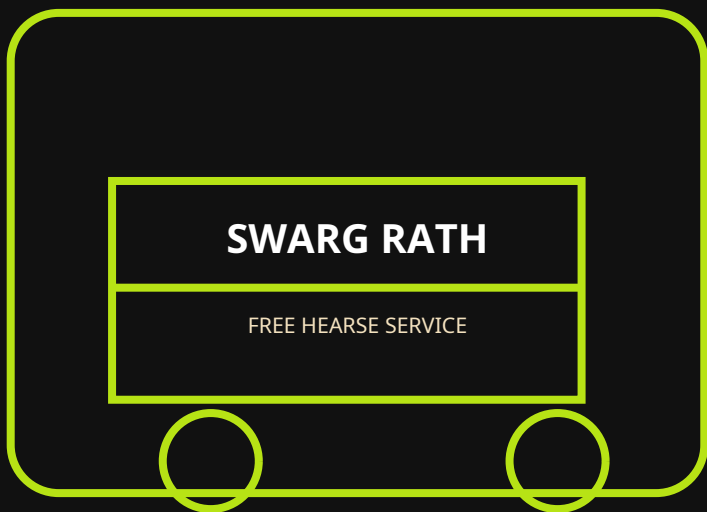
Safety Message

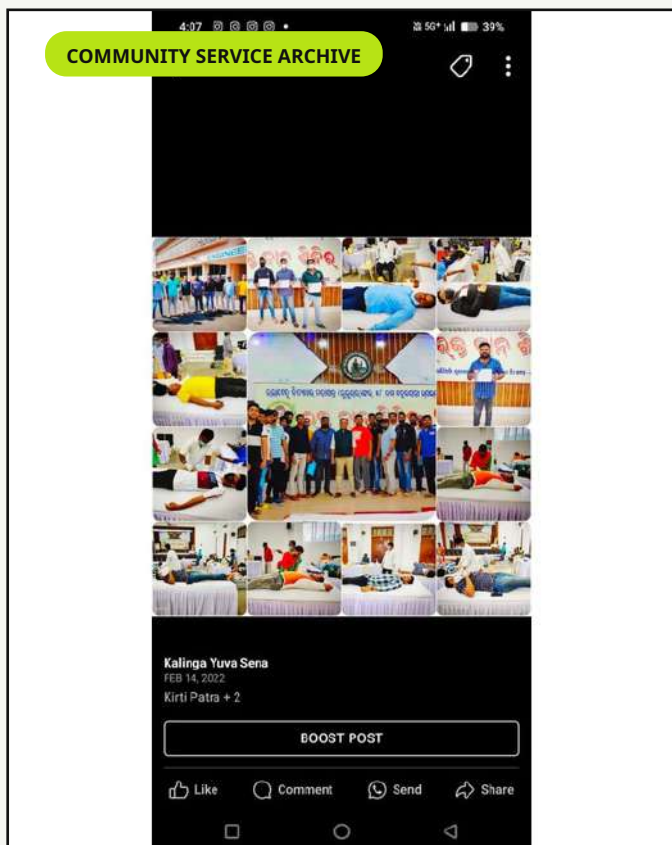

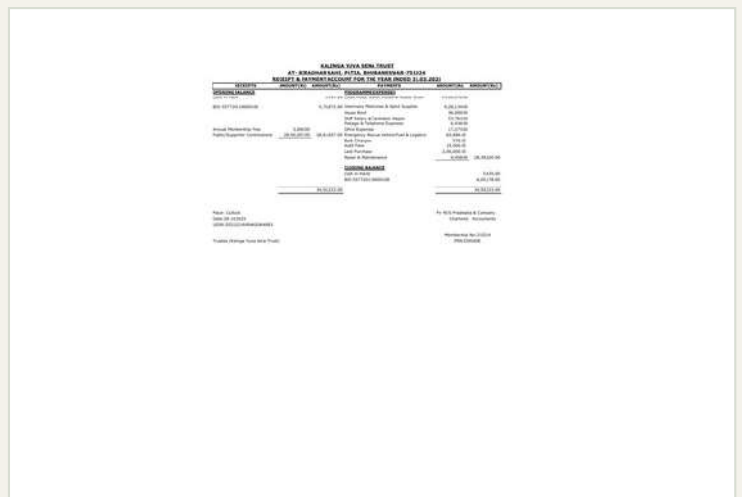
